Education, Military Service and Work

After graduating high school, Chuck served a tour of duty in the Marines and then went to work at Aerojet for four years before moving with Nita to Minnesota for a year, and Indiana for three. Chuck ran the computer center at Indiana State University at night and attended University classes during the day, studying information services and computer science.

When he and Nita moved back to California, Chuck started working for Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) as a supervisor in the Computer Services, Spaceflight Operations Facility, Main Frame Division. While he was there, the Spaceflight Operations Facility tracked the Viking 1 and Viking 2 Mars Landings, which was pretty exciting. Chuck returned to Aerojet in 1977 and worked as Operations Manager for the next 25 years before retiring in 2004.

Leisure

Super athlete Chuck enjoys any activity that involves water (liquid or frozen) including surfing, sailing, scuba diving and snow skiing. In his teens he surfed on a long board with buddies **Cliff Thorpe**, **Mike McClellan** and **Finn Moller** at Doheny, San Onofre and Huntington. Now he surfs with his children and grandchildren on a long board that was given to Nita on her 18th birthday. He started scuba diving at 13 with **Sue Weatherwax-Maxwell** and still scuba dives, thanks to Sue. His favorite diving spot is Tahiti, however he spends a lot of time diving in Catalina because it's close to home. Whistler, British Columbia is his favorite ski resort, though he prefers Brian Head, Utah for family trips. Oh, did I mention that he used to race a Hondo 250cc dirt bike?

Sailing is really Chuck's first love (well, second, after Nita). He served as Commodore and Director of the Alamitos Bay Yacht Club and has competed 18 times in the Newport to Ensenada race, which is the largest international yacht race in the world. Chuck placed 5th in the Transpacific where he raced from Los Angeles to Hawaii and then sailed all the way back. On the return trip he encountered rough seas with strong winds and 30' waves breaking every 17 seconds. He and his crew were harnessed in and tethered to the boat for three days straight. They also enjoy Caribbean Cruises, watching the sunset from the deck of their Belmont Shores condo, and spending time with their six grandchildren.
